Description

After installing Chrome on your computer, you may want to use it as your default browser . Usually the application itself asks this question for you when it is first opened, but if it is not the case, proceed as follows: Go to the Chrome settings (type chrome: // settings in the address bar and press the Enter key or click on the Chrome button in the upper right corner of the screen and go to "Settings"), scroll to the end, and click the "Make Chrome the default browser" button. Signing in to your Google account Signing in to Chrome can bring a number of benefits to you, such as bookmarking, browsing history, and even open tabs between multiple devices (for example, different PCs and smartphones or tablets). So before you start doing anything, sign in to Chrome. Click on the profile icon at the top of the window. Then click "Sign in to Chrome," enter your Google account details and you're done. One of Chrome's coolest features is data synchronization. This allows you to always have the same browser, regardless of where you access the internet. This feature is ideal for those who use different PCs at home and at work and still have a tablet or smartphone. To do this, type the command chrome: // settings / syncSetup in the Chrome address bar and press Enter. If you prefer, click the Chrome menu Settings. There, in the "Sign in" section, click "Advanced sync settings."

Review

Google Chrome is a multi-platform web browser developed by Google. It was first released in 2008 for Microsoft Windows, and later ported to Linux, macOS, iOS and Android. The browser is also the main component of Chrome OS, where it serves as a platform for web applications.

In 2010, Google launched Chrome Web Store, an online marketplace where users can purchase and install Web-based applications to run inside the browser; these applications are available as browser extensions or links to websites.

As of July 2019, StatCounter estimates that Chrome has a worldwide market share of 71% of browsers on traditional PCs and 63.34% on all platforms. Because of this success, Google has extended the "Chrome" brand to other products: Chrome OS, Chromecast, Chromebook, Chromebit, Chromebox and Chromebase.

Chrome is one of the safest web browsers available, it does not allow ransomware, trojans and harmful viruses to automatically download to your computer like other browsers do, it recognizes

and warns about most phishing schemes when you try to access them and also blocks pop-up windows, includes a password manager and allows private browsing.

The browser offers many functions such as for example you can edit documents from your browser and store them in the cloud, since we do not have to worry about breaking our computer or not being on our staff.

You can automatically search many websites without having to go to those sites, as long as they are in your list of search engines, this feature is useful if you want, for example, to go directly to Wikipedia entries omitting the initial pages of Google or Wikipedia.

Google can also use basic mathematics in the classic search center box, if you type a basic mathematical problem, the correct answer appears in the suggestions below the Omnibox without even having to press Enter.

If you need to read something fast on another tab, try holding down the Control key (Mac Command) and a number from 1 to 9. In fact, each number is associated with a different card from 1 (the leftmost tab) and will gradually rise to the rightmost tab (if we have 5 tabs open, the last tab on the right will be the fifth).

You can also create your own shortcuts for the extensions we have downloaded; if you go to the Extensions window (from the Settings menu), you will find "Keyboard shortcuts" at the bottom of the window. This window allows you to create keyboard shortcuts to start any active extension in the library: for example, if you download the Hangouts application from Google, you can create a keyboard shortcut for the contact list to display in a quick pop-up window.
